NEW UNDERGRADUATE COURSES (6)

- (1) COMM 338: Documentary Filmmaking I: Concepts, 3 credits, D. Proposal for course focused on the history and theory of documentary films.
- (2) ITEC 222: Transportation and Automation, 3 credits. Proposal for course to study transportation and automation systems, including control systems leading to automation and robotics.
- (3) ITEC 327: Engineering Structures, 3 credits. Proposal for course for students to use science, technology, engineering, and mathematical principles to design, construct and evaluate model structures.
- (4) LATS 491: Topics in Latina/o Studies, 3 credits. Proposal for course to invesitgate topics related to cultures, contributions, and experiences of Latinas/os living the the United States.
- (5) MGMT 312: Principles of Entrepreneurship, 3 credits. Proposal for course to introduce students to the process of turning an idea into a successful start-up business.
- (6) MUSI 327: Marauder Men's Glee Club, 0.5 credit. Proposal for course focused on choral repertoire, ensemble vocal technique, performance practice, and artistry through singing in men's chorus.
