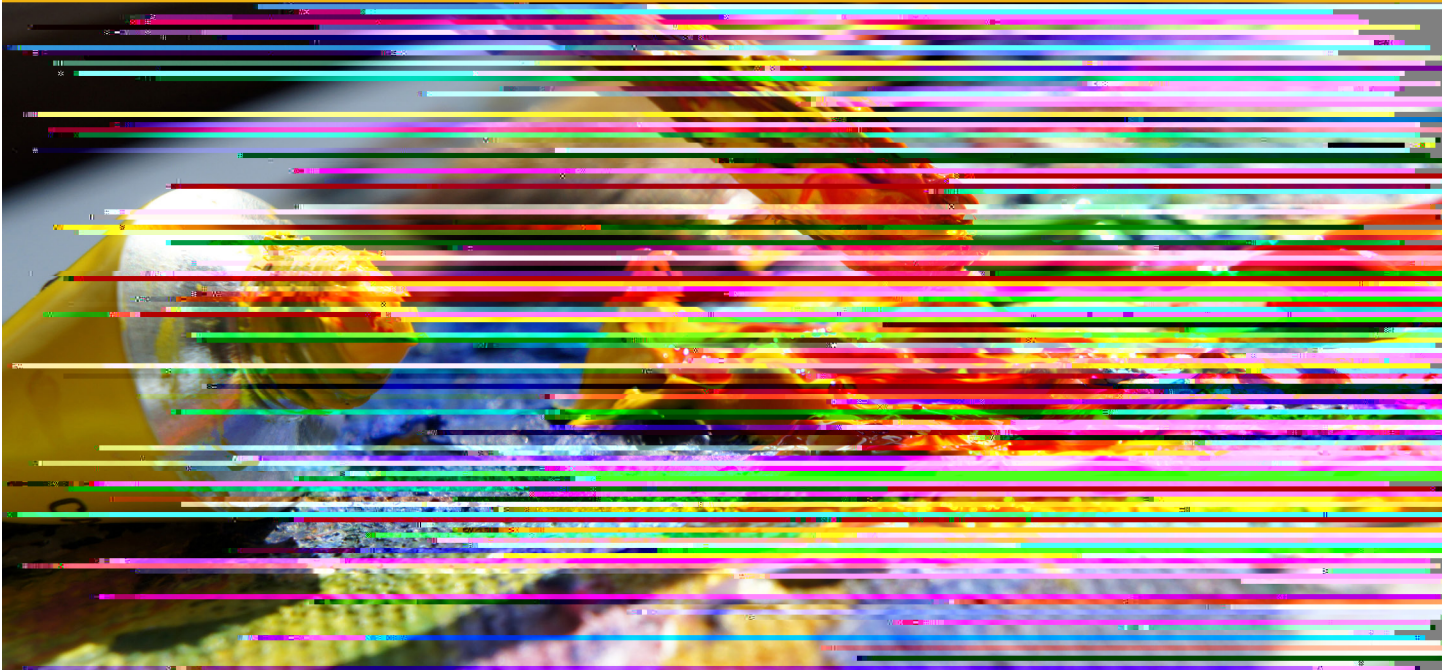


Expressive Arts Certificate

POST BACCALAUREATE CERTIFICATE IN EXPRESSIVE ARTS
